

Focus Area 1: Neighbourhoods and Communities

Community-based emergency management

Australian Red Cross	Community Led Emergency Resilience	Strengthened disaster resilience at a community level so people are more aware of risks, emergency management arrangements and their roles during emergencies.
Australian Red Cross	Resilience Recharge	Based on 'Talk out Loud' a previous Red Cross mental health project, Resilience Recharge has designed and delivered social activities, combined with educational messaging for families around disaster preparedness and building resilience to the ongoing impact of drought.
Australian Red Cross	Climate Ready Communities	Established a state-wide program with participating councils to engage and equip community members across regional and metropolitan South Australia to champion climate preparedness in their community.
City of Adelaide	Community Resilience Leaders Emergency Volunteer Program	The Community Resilience Leaders Emergency Volunteers Program established a community-based volunteering and development program in the City of Adelaide to engage city residents and business staff, as volunteers in community-led emergency resilience capacity building.
AdaptWest	Residential Building Retrofit for Climate Change	Determined the feasibility of a self-sustaining program to enable targeted residents to retrofit their homes to reduce the impacts of climate change.

Innovative insurance options

Good Shepherd Microfinance	Insuring Against Disaster: A Practical Toolkit to Prepare Financially for Emergencies	Financially resilient communities and households are better equipped to recover from the impacts of an unforeseen disaster. The project developed a practical toolkit for South Australians that leveraged past learnings and was specifically designed for and with South Australian communities.
South Australian Council of Social Service (SACOSS)	Identifying Strategies to Maximise Access to Insurance	This project involves research into insurance funding models nationally and internationally as well as exploring innovative new approaches to funding insurance for people experiencing poverty and financial stress. Working in collaboration with Red Cross, Good Shepherd Microfinance and SA Financial Counselling Association, will explore different options for maximising access to insurance for people at risk and in poverty.

Volunteering SA & NT	Building Regional Volunteer Capacity	In collaboration with Australian Red Cross, this program built volunteering capacity of emergency services agencies and organisations in regional areas of South Australia through a collaborative inter-agency approach to recruitment, on boarding and engagement.

SAFECOM	State Emergency Management Communications and Engagement Framework	Engaged with all levels of Government, business, NGOs and the community to establish a Framework that delivers emergency management information through key messages and a shared approach to improve community disaster resilience.

Small business resilience

Rural Business Support	Building Business Ready Networks - Regional Networks of Businesses Prepared for Natural Disasters	Developed an on-line planning tool to assist 135 rural businesses to create their own tailored business survival plans.
SAFECOM	Emergency Services Business Network	Engagement with businesses and emergency services partners to encourage employers to support staff to engage in emergency services volunteering activities.

Focus Area 3: Children and Young People

Scoping exercise with children and young people

Australian Red Cross	Leave it to Z	Supported the Emergency Services sector to build their understanding of the youth voice in preparedness and recovery and to develop effective engagement and implementation models.
Australian Red Cross	Leave it to Z (Stage 2)	Children and young people will be active participants in implementing measures working in collaboration with the Emergency Management sector to co-develop an implementation strategy arising from the stage one Youth Perspectives Roadmap.
Australian Red Cross	Be Prepared - not just a motto	Empowering SA Guides and Scouts with a manual developed to help build the resilience of their communities.
Growing with Gratitude	A School Based Resilience Program	Expanded the School Based Resilience Program into a free online module focussed on teaching conscious practice of service to others (volunteering), gratitude, empathy, kindness and positive reflection - creating resilient and connected young people.
Australian Red Cross	Digi-prepped	Engaged Mighty Kingdom as software developers and with input from school children; a co-designed app was developed to deliver key messaging on disaster preparedness, in an innovative and engaging way.
Schools Ministry Group	Building Resilient Connections in and around School Communities	The program delivered a resilience building workshop for school staff, children and their families. Enabling all participants to have a resilient communication tool to aid more effective and efficient post-disaster recovery.

Incept Labs and SAFECOM	Disaster Resilience Innovation Challenges - Pilot	The Innovation Challenge engaged secondary school children (both urban and regional) to develop and present problem-solving workshops to support Emergency Services strategies.

Emergency management capability

Torrens Resilience Institute	Activating Community Resilience	This project investigated the relationship between Emergency Services and communities to determine the ways in which agency responses may either bolster or disable community resilience during an emergency.
DPC	Real-time Monitoring System for State Emergency Centre	Collating near real-time monitoring of a significant number of systems into a single dashboard to form a common operating picture for emergency response, public information and damage assessment.

SAFECOM	State Level Risk Assessment	Review the State-level hazard-based risk assessment and incorporate emerging and strategic risks into emergency management assurance processes.
DPC	Understanding Consequence Management	Establish an agreed understanding that will strategically improve emergency management governance and decision-making through integration into emergency management policy and practice.

Relationship with local government

LGA	Council Ready	<p>The Council Ready program was developed to support all South Australian councils to produce tailored emergency management plans to reduce the impacts of emergencies on their communities.</p> <p>This program provided best-practice guidance on local government emergency management planning and implemented this through a strengths-based capacity building approach.</p> <p>All 68 SA councils participated, resulting in 46 policies, 39 plans, 51 operations manuals and 15 recovery plans being adopted.</p>

Diversity & Inclusion

Vietnamese Community in Australia	Beyond Disaster - A CALD Communities Action Plan to Stay Resilient	This project has established a CALD project Advisory Group with eight communities. Resources were developed to present emergency alert messaging to language groups.
Australian Red Cross	Escape the Elements - Designing Extreme Weather Kits for People who are Homeless	Building on the success of the Out of the Storm pilot, Red Cross partnered with local community service providers to implement the evidence-based replicable model in six regional locations across South Australia.
Multicultural Communities of SA	Building Resilient CALD communities	The project presented to CALD communities in Adelaide Metropolitan Area, translating messaging for disasters and preparedness.
Uniting Communities	Disaster Resilience Education Project	The Disaster Resilience Education Project developed materials and a training module for disaster resilience education. The project leveraged an existing financial literacy program and delivered to the networks 3,500+ low income and vulnerable community members.
SACOSS	Roles and Responsibilities for Organisations Providing Services to People at Risk	This project clarified roles and responsibilities of community service organisations (CSOs) in prevention, preparedness, response and recovery by developing a matrix of responsibilities for CSO's according to level of responsibility, including moral/societal obligation in addition to contractual or formal requirements.
Australian Red Cross	CALD Communities - Locally Led Risk Reduction Project	This project seeks to support CALD communities to implement their own locally-led disaster risk reduction activities. Utilising an asset-based community development approach, Red Cross will partner with the City of Port Adelaide Enfield and City of Mount Gambier where 2-3 specific locations will be selected for the delivery of the project.

SACOSS	Health and Community Service Sector Climate Disaster Risk Reduction Capacity Building and Collaboration	SACOSS will build the capacity of the community services sector to respond to the challenges and reduce risks posed by climate related emergencies and disasters.
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
