Emergency Services Reform Communique 1

As part of the process of responding to the Holloway Review into the Fire and Emergency Services Act, 2005 and to ensure the emergency service sector is properly resourced to meet future challenges, the Minister for Police and Emergency Services has commenced a series of roundtable discussions with key parties involved in the Emergency Services Sector.

The roundtables are a forum to discuss ways to build upon the existing positive working relationships between the CFS, SES and MFS and the high level of services they deliver to the community.

The first in the series of roundtables, held on 12 June 2014, were very productive resulting in some key guiding principles that will inform any future reform process.

Some of the principles included (but were not limited to):

- One integrated organisation, delivering three services, with the ability to allocate resources and deliver a response on a state-wide basis, reflective of state-wide risks
- Acknowledge the important role volunteers play in the emergency services sector
- Maintain the existing high level of frontline services (and increase the opportunity for greater collaboration/cooperation)
- Retain a level of autonomy (and flexibility) at the local level for volunteers and ensure that they have representation at the highest level of decision making in any proposed sector reform.

These principles, as well as ideas for improvements and issues to be addressed are being further developed and refined through a set of regional visits with key members of the Sector through June, to early August.

The first three regional roundtables have been completed in the Riverland, Port Augusta and Clare. The roundtables were facilitated by the Minister for Emergency Services with over 200 volunteers and staff from the emergency sector in attendance.

So far, the roundtables have been well received with robust debate on how to improve the sector. Participants have expressed a wide range of views which have all been constructive.

Representatives from all organisations will be involved in the consolidation of stakeholder feedback, with the initial engagement process expected to be concluded in September this year. At this point in time no decisions have been made.
